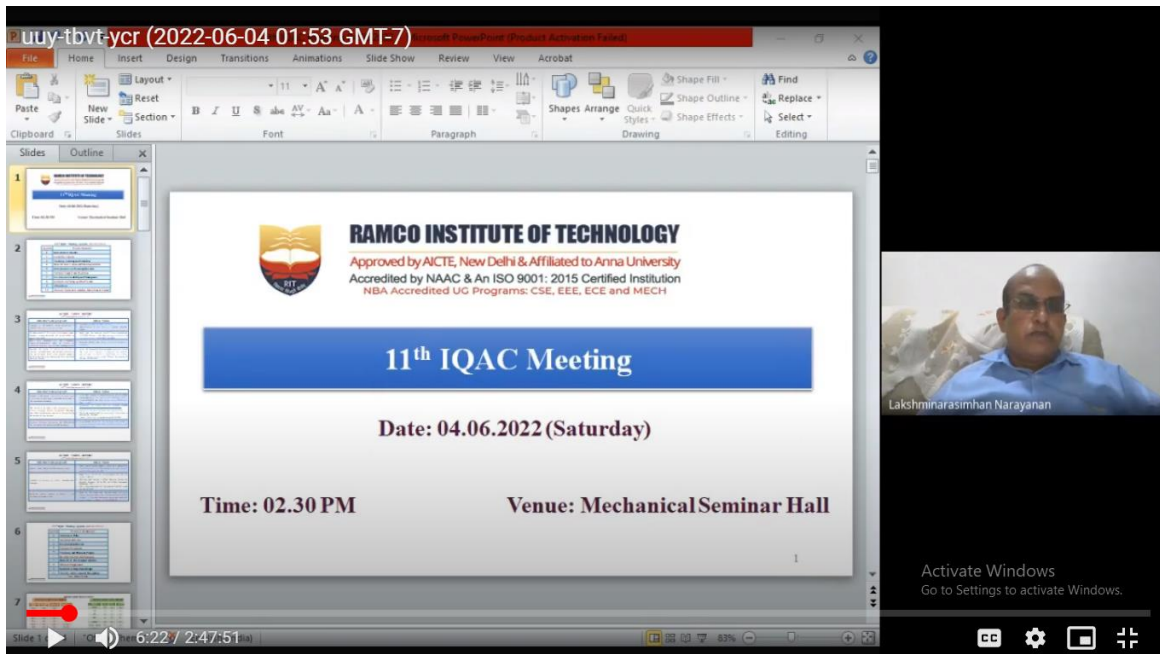


Fig.2 Mr.N.Lakshminarasimhan, General Manager-HR, Brakes India Private Limited Padi,Chennai shared his greetings to all the members

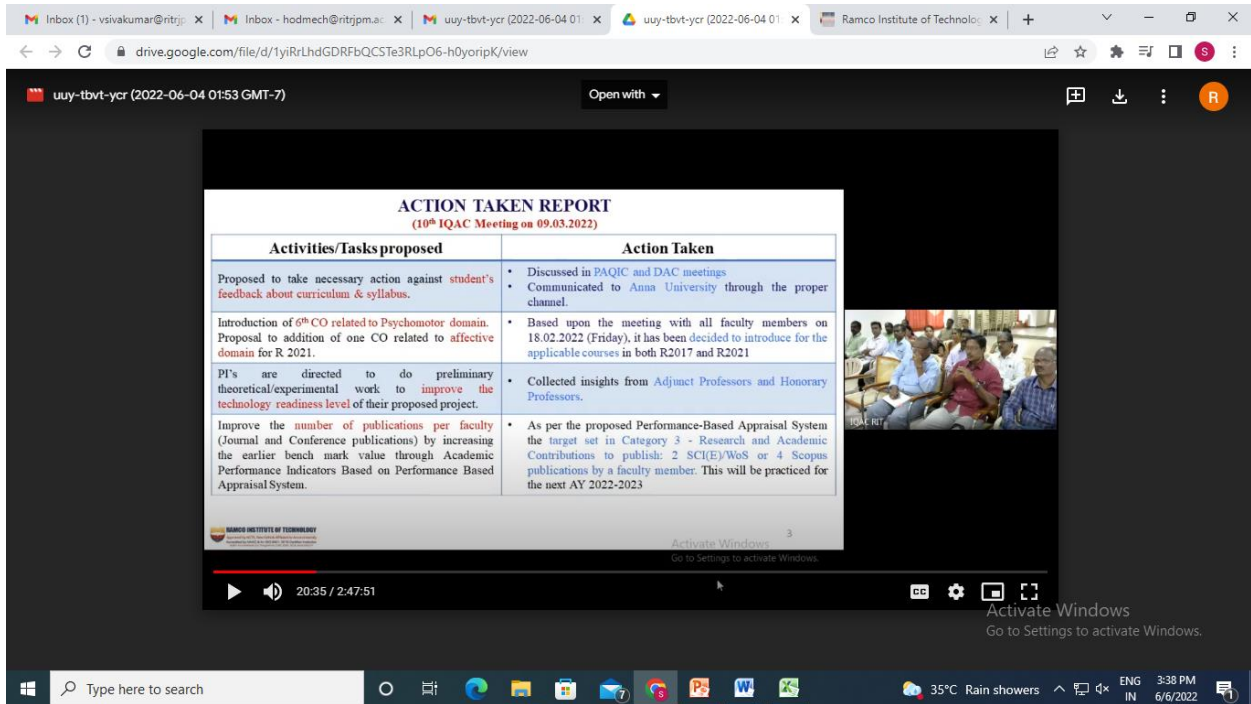


Fig. 3 **Mr.R.JEGANATHAN**, HoD/Mathematics, Ayya Nadar Janaki Ammal College, Sivakasi Physically present and shared his views in the meeting.

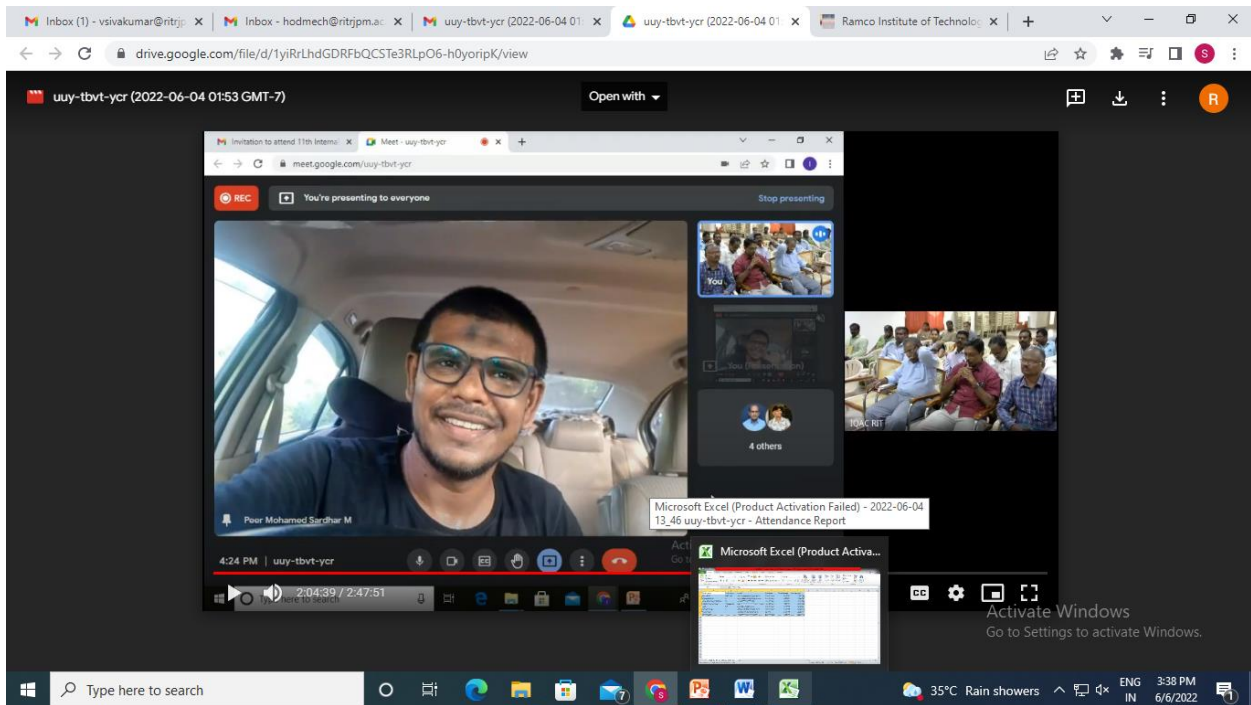


Fig.4 **Mr.M. PEER MOHAMED SARDHAR** , Senior Manager HR, MHL, CAN International Group and shared his views in the meeting.

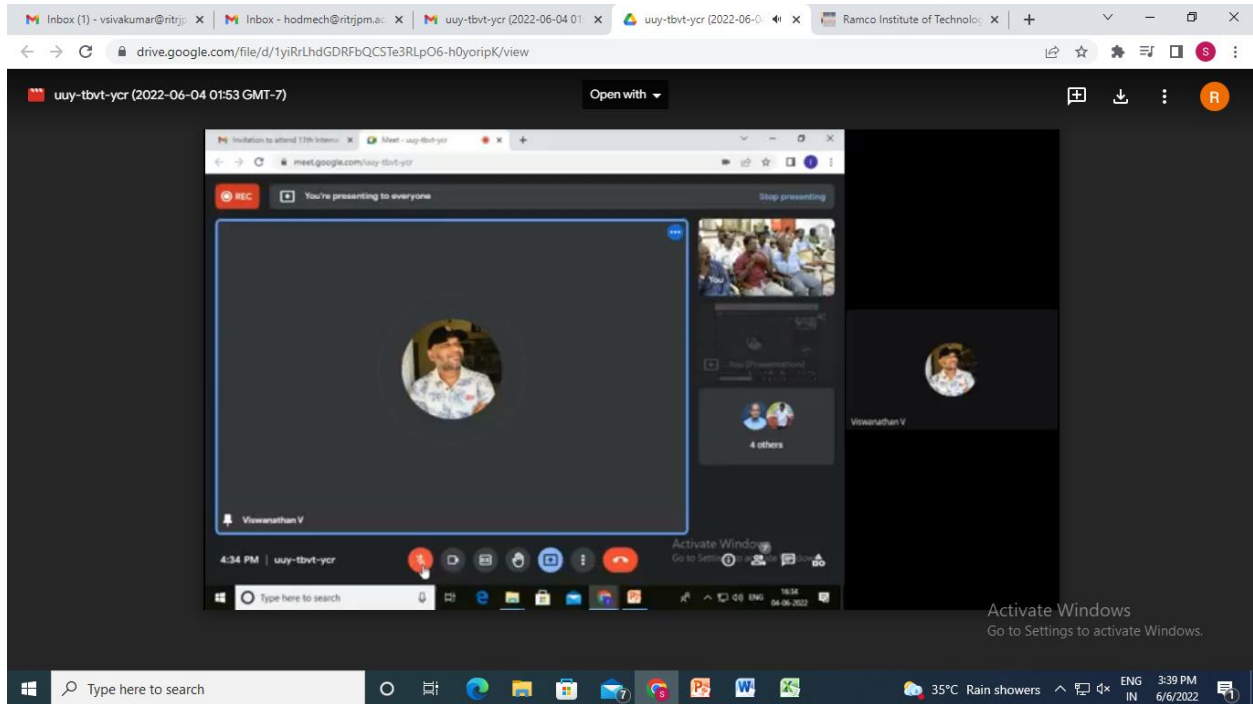

On behalf of the RIT-IQAC team, Dr.S.Rajakarunakaran, IQAC Coordinator, presented Agenda 1 to Agenda 10, Strategic Perspective Plan 2022-2027, and Institutional Preparedness for NEP-2020 to the IQAC members. The detailed presentation is attached as an annexure with these meeting minutes.

Mr.R.Jeganathan, HoD/Mathematics, Ayya Nadar Janaki Ammal College, Sivakasi, External IQAC member suggestion as follows:

- Shared his views in three major categories. 1) Action taken in preparation for the 10th IQAC meeting 2) Strategic Perspective Plan 2022-2027; and 3) Nep-2020 Institutional Preparedness.
- Suggested to include the salient feedback received from the students (without highlighting their name, year of study, or branch) and list how was it addressed?
- Recommended to re-consider the target set in the "Academic Performance Indicators Based on Performance Based Appraisal System": faculty per publication for the AY 2022-2023 (2 SCIE/WoS or 4 Scopus publications). It is suggested that faculty members be encouraged and rewarded for producing more high-quality publications (SCI (E)/WoS). In the revised bench mark set for the faculty per publication, attention may be given to the faculty members who are contributing to the institute level growth continuously.
- Appreciated the extension activities carried out through NSS (29 events with 353 student participation) and suggested involving more faculty members in extension and outreach activities. Create a natural club like "Flora and Fauna Club" and nominate

any faculty member who has an interest in being associated with the development of nature activities.

- Commended for conducting an annual Sports Day and allocating funds for R & D/EDC/IIC/IPR for improving research and IPR outcomes as per the guidelines of the "National Innovation and Startup Policy 2019 for Students and Faculty."
- NAAC has revised its guidelines for green, energy, and environmental audits for educational institutions. He has advised to adhere to the revised guidelines.
- Congratulations on being willing to start a new alumni chapter in Chennai and increase enrolment for the academic year 2022–2023. He suggested going for any kind of certificate or add-on courses for societal development, if possible.
- Appreciated the campus visit arrangement for 1182 students from 21 schools towards scientific popularization. Highlighted the students enrolled in the AY 2021–2022 feedback analysis, which indicates a 50% choice for admission made by parents.
- Suggested to indicate the student progression index as
(No. of students placed + No. of students progressing to higher Education + No. of entrepreneurs) / Total no. of students enrolled in the batch.
- Proposed to introduce an interdisciplinary research forum and do research that may provide support towards promoting holistic and multidisciplinary liberal education.
- Suggested that students be constantly supported and encouraged to take online courses and participate in co-curricular and extra-curricular activities.
- It is recommended to do projects related to social orientation and record the particulars for future reference (NEP 2020). Aligned with Arts and Science colleges and industry, they try to organise seminars, workshops, conferences, and science exhibitions, 30 hours of credit add-on courses for the student community. If possible, recruit a trainer for soft skill development through the Training and Placement Cell. Conduct at least one programme per year related to ethics. Increasing the scope for blended teaching opportunities, skilling courses connected with industry (virtual mode), bilingual teaching, technical word vocabulary in the local language, and conduct of vocational courses through online, RIT collaborates with other colleges and offers courses (Diploma Certificate Courses), innovation exhibition for RIT students or combined with other schools and colleges (common to all branches), Inaugurate the RIT Resource Team with office bearers as various stake holders and conduct a programme for the physically challenged as an outreach activity.
- Suggested to maintain uniformity in budget expenditure by all the departments under various heads.

Mr.N.Lakshminarasimhan, General Manager-HR, Brakes India Private Limited, Padi, Chennai, External IQAC member suggestion as follows:

- Admired the content presented in the meeting and appreciated the overall progress of the college in all dimensions.
- Insisted on considering three things for continual development, such as i) Be Agile, ii) Think Digital, and iii) Become Nimble. Collaborate with adjunct reputable institutions and industry, equip all sub-systems with the capability of handling digital generation

students, and complete the initiative as quickly as possible with no time lag. Shift the gears for accelerating growth

- Address the students who faced failure and do some fruitful things for their betterment through proper standard operating procedures.

Mr.M.Peer Mohamed Sardhar, Senior Manager HR, MHL, CAN International Group, External IQAC member suggestion as follows:

- Appreciated the overall content presented in the 11th IQAC meeting.
- Suggested to include the overall good things that have been done during this period under the heading of RIT IQAC Highlights. It should have the following: i) Campus recruitment achievements ii) Admission achievements and iii) Other achievements
- Library utilisation should be improved.
- An Incubation Centre should be started at RIT with all the departments. This kind of incubation centre will offer internships for our students and generate funds.
- Highlighted the scope for development of SIPCOT in the Tirunelveli and Tuticorin areas. It was also suggested to work with the manufacturing industries and obtain fruitful outcomes by doing research and technical consultancy.
- Suggested to create an opportunity for students to do one year certificate courses in the fields of Artificial Intelligence, Data Science, Machine Learning, Business Analytics, and Human Resource Analytics.
- Recommended to take some initiatives to make students clear national level competitive exams through the carrier guidance cell.

Dr.M.Jayaraman, F/o J.Sneghavardhini, IV Year Civil, Assistant Professor, PG & Research Department of Mathematics, Raja Doraisingam Government Arts College, Sivagangai External IQAC member suggestion as follows:

- It is suggested that details about higher education specifics be included in student progression.
- Recommended to concentrate on Sports Quota admission.
- Advised to improve publication quality in collaboration with student members

- Appreciated the introduction of domain coordinators in all departments.
- Praised the efforts taken in the admission, campus placement, and research and development activities.
- Advised to include top management input in the presentation on their requirement and observation on teaching quality and its continual progress.
- Suggested to go in for automation and methods that can help faculty members to spend more time for class room preparation, research and developmental activities.
- Suggested to review - how accreditation and management system contributing for the organic growth of the institution.

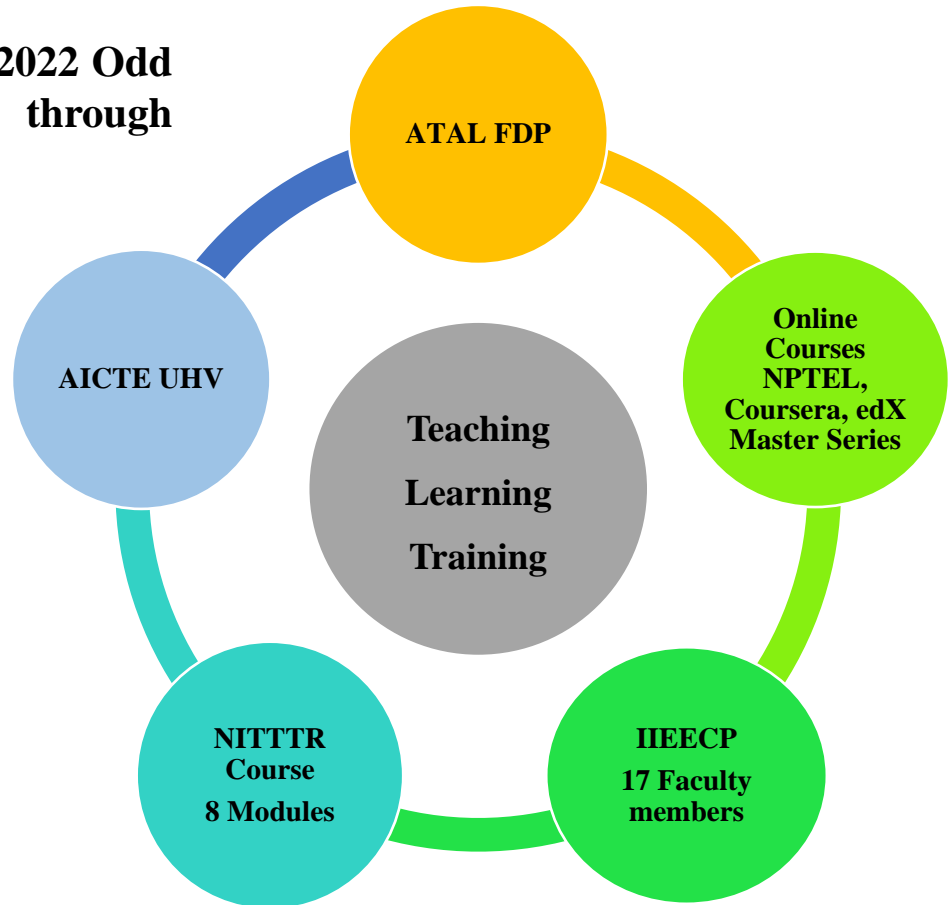
Plan of Admission Activities for 2022 – 2023

- ❖ From the analysis 50% choice for admission was made by Parents and 35% by students own choice.

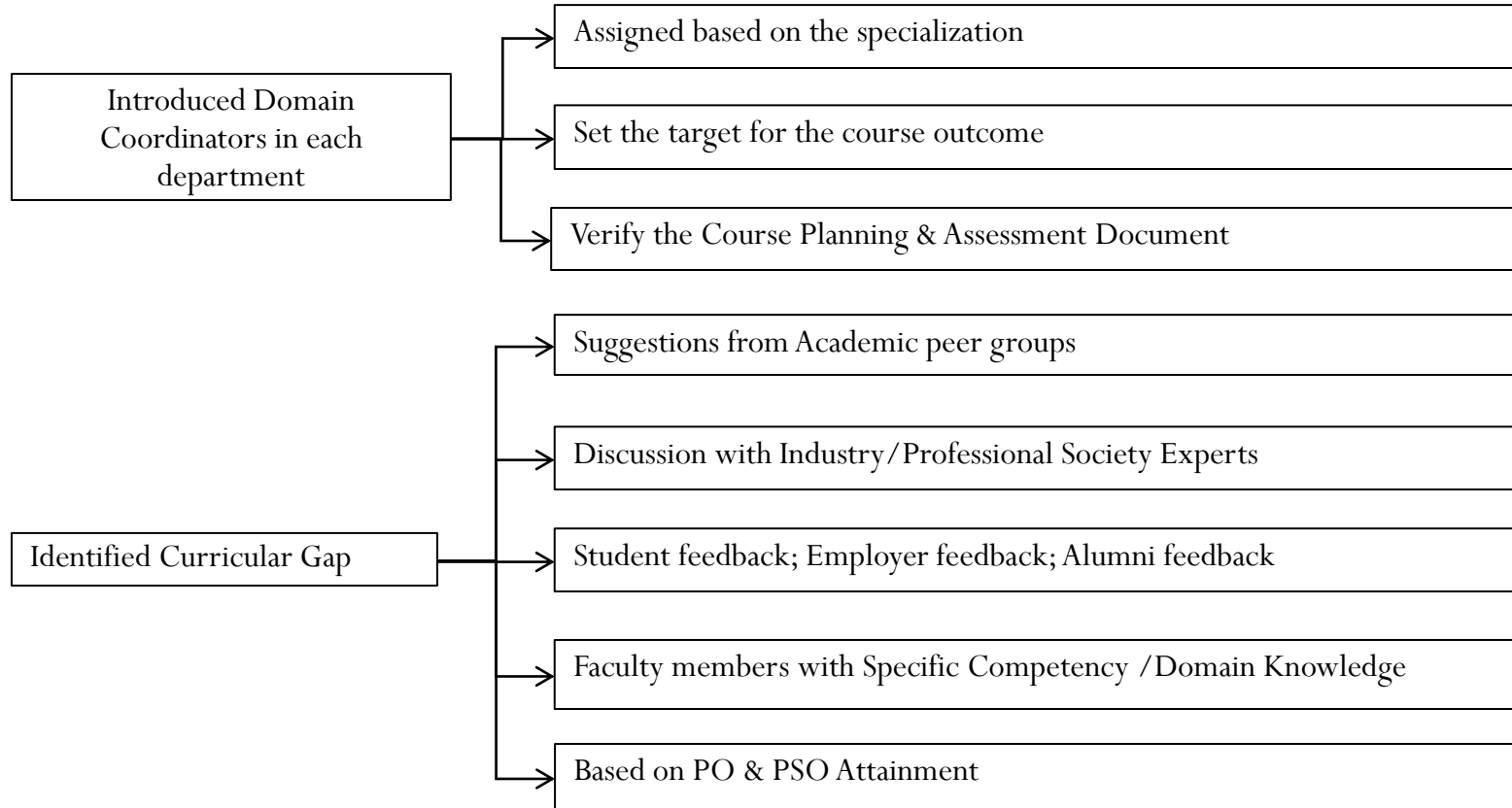

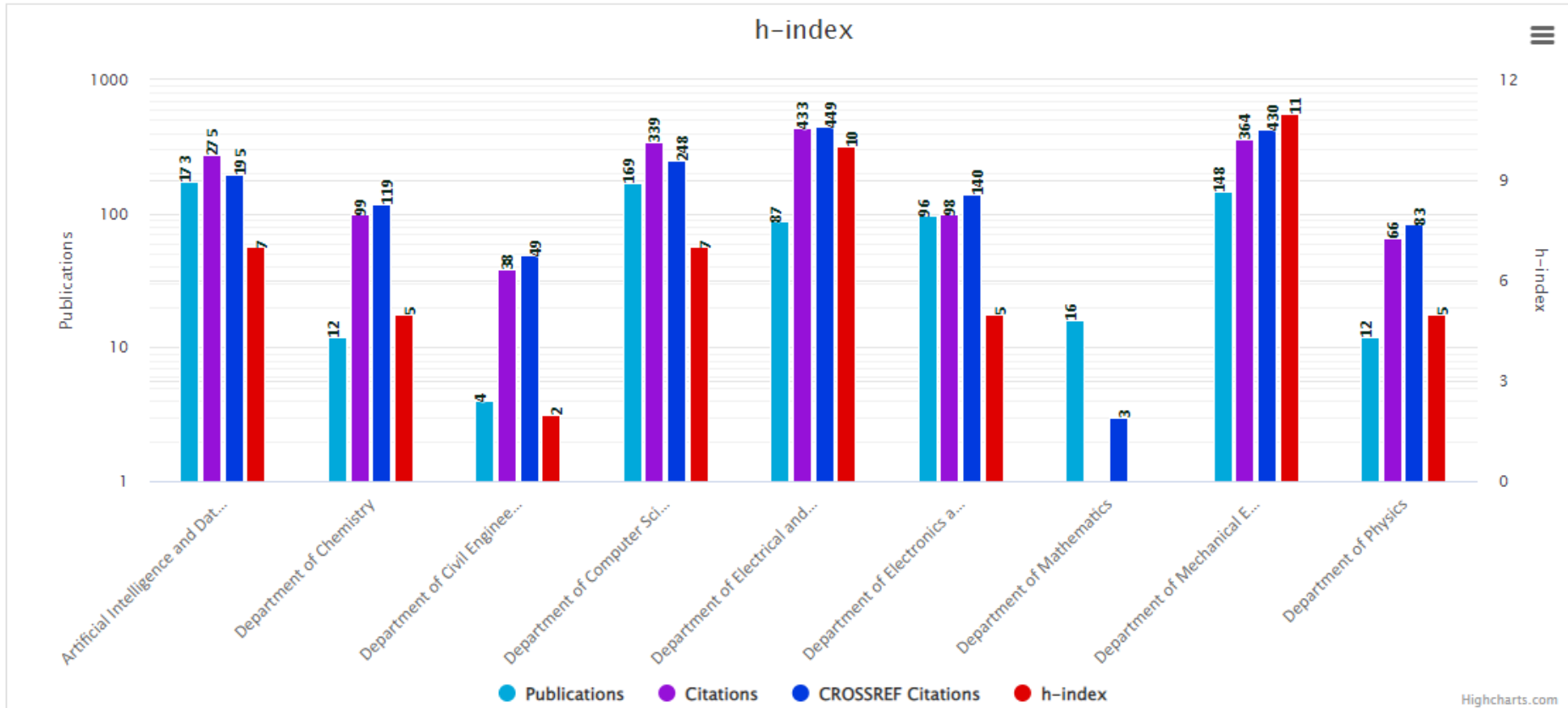

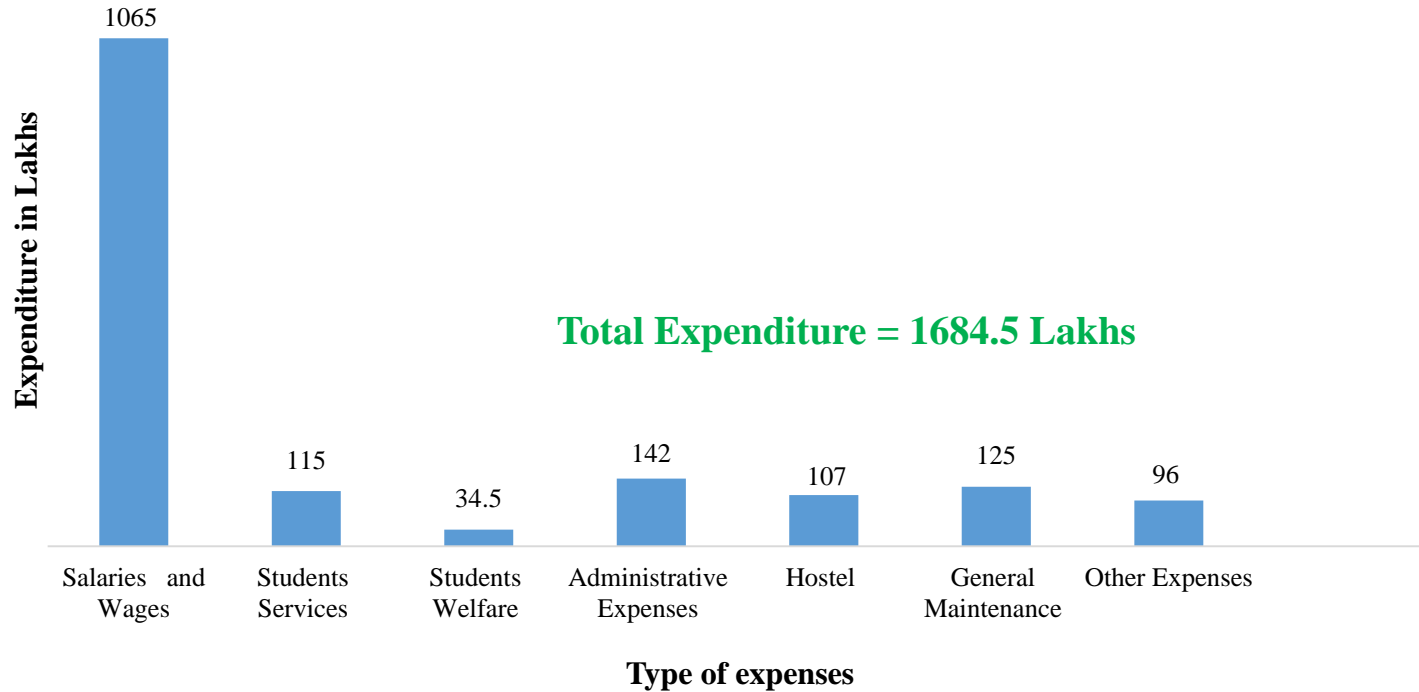
